do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 24th day of April 1916, and at day of May

1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely: \* One hundred twenty cases of Globe Metal Polish consigned by said Rames & Co Ltd through the Belfast Irish Steam Packet Coy Ltd to Dublin for sale which were stored on the premises of the said British & Irish Steam Packet Co Ltd at Sir John Rogersons Quay Dublin

and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by \*\* looting from said premises by persons unlawfully and tumultuously assembled.
